





Demonstrating Our Positive Impact



The Need

7% of young people in Ventura County fail to graduate from high school on time.2

What We Do

We provide a wide-range of extracurricular educational instruction and resources year-round and activities that supplement youth's learning while keeping with their academic curricula.

Our Impact

Among our teen-aged Club members, 96% expect to graduate from high school, and 96% expect to complete some kind of post-secondary education.

The Need

24% of high-school youth in Ventura County were involved in a physical fight in the past year.³

What We Do

Our Character and Leadership programs challenge kids to be community-minded and empower them by demonstrating how they can affect change by working together.

Our Impact

89% of Club teen members volunteer in their community at least once per year, while 78% volunteer in their community at least once per month.





The Need

35% of young people ages 10-15 in Ventura County are overweight or obese.4

What We Do

From building self-esteem and confidence to providing healthy snacks and activities, Clubs offer a breadth of ways that kids can develop healthy habits for life.

Our Impact

98% of Club members ages 9 and older report getting at least an hour of physical activity on five or more days per week.
